## Year 9 Vaccinations are now due at your child's school FARINGDON COMMUNITY COLLEGE

As part of your child's ongoing healthcare, we would like to remind you about the importance of the upcoming Td/IPV and MenACWY vaccinations for students in Year 9. These vaccines are an essential part of protecting your child against serious infectious diseases and a team of vaccinators will be coming to your child's school on the following dates:

Main Session	25/04/2025
Catch up session	26/06/2025

If your child misses the main session, they may be vaccinated in the catch up session.

Td/IPV Vaccine (Tetanus, Diphtheria and Inactivated Polio), also known as the 3 in 1 vaccine or Teenage Booster

This is one vaccine and helps protect your child against:

- Tetanus (a serious bacterial infection that affects the nervous system)
- Diphtheria (a bacterial infection that can cause difficulty breathing)
- Polio (a virus that can lead to paralysis)

Young people need a total of five doses of Td/IPV vaccine and the 5*th* and final dose is usually given in Year 9. The previous doses are usually given prior to starting school

## Meningococcal ACWY Vaccine

This vaccine aims to protect your child against meningococcal disease, a rare but potentially life-threatening infection that can cause meningitis and septicaemia. This is one vaccine given at the same time as the Td/IPV and helps prevent infections caused by certain strains of the meningococcus bacteria (A, C, W, and Y).

To consent or refuse the vaccination, you need to complete a consent form at least one school day prior to the session date. The link will then close temporarily and reopen once the session has finished.

Once submitted, the consent form remains valid until the vaccines have been given. Therefore, it is important you inform us of any medical changes
