The first term of Yr13 will involve completing a geographical investigation on a topic of the students choice supported by the geography staff

Lesson style:

Variety of teacher led, group discussions, individual research, fieldwork and feedback

Time Allocation:

8 Periods per fortnight (4 Physical and 4 Human lessons taught by subject specialist)

Private Study Requirement:

Each hour in the classroom must be supported by an equivalent hour outside the classroom undertaking individual research, essay and data response, questions and developing fieldwork skills Keeping abreast of current affairs is beneficial by reading quality newspapers and watching relevant documentaries. A level 6 at GCSE is the preferred entry requirement

Extra Curricular Opportunities:

Week residential fieldwork at Stackpole, Pembrokeshire to develop fieldwork skills is strongly advised
